Since the onset of Ebola in Liberia and neighboring West African countries, has the Embassy suspended the issuance of visas for travel to the United States? If not, then in the aftermath of the first confirmed case of Ebola appearing in the United States having originated from Liberia, I believe it is prudent to suspend the issuing of visas to the United States until the Ebola epidemic has ended. I furthermore request the suspension of previously issued visas by the Embassy that are still currently valid for travel to the United States.

Suspending and ceasing the issuance of visas for nationals of Liberia would significantly reduce the chances of Ebola further spreading to the United States. We must act swiftly to take every prudent measure to protect the American public from further exposure to Ebola.
